

Division Statistics*



The goal for D11NR for 2009 is **7,800** VSC's. We are **8%** of our goal for the year and **65%** of 2008 production! The data source is AUXINFO. PLEASE be certain that all stats are reported MONTHLY using the CURRENT Form 7038 to your FSO-IS so you and your unit(s) will receive proper credit.

Additional stats from AUXINFO* indicates that **290** or **45%** of our VSC's are First Time VSC's. In addition **331** or **52%** are High Risk VSC's.

VSC Questions - Answers can be found in another location in the newsletter

- 1-Because of unusual circumstances, you were unable to conduct five VSC's last year. What happens now?
 - a. You have to do ten this year to keep your qualifications and to make up for last year.
 - b. You have to do at least two VSC's under supervision of a certified VE to regain your qualification and then five for this year.
 - c. You can request that the DSO-VE grant you a one-time waiver.
 - d. You can't regain your qualifications. Once you miss a year, you're too rusty to be an effective VE.
- 2-At least one wearable PFD for each person on board must be on board to meet VSC requirements for boats that are:
 - a. All vessels.
 - b. 26' or greater in length
 - c. 40' or greater in length
 - d. Less than 16' in length

-VSC Decal Shortage

Currently there is a temporary shortage of VSC Decals, and ANSC is OUT OF STOCK. Because only 150,000 VSC's are performed annually by the Auxiliary and the Power Squadron, State Farm Insurance reduced the initial distribution of decals from 400,000 to 250,000 decals. An additional supply has been requested from State Farm and there currently is no ETA.

PLEASE do not hoard decals and distribute current local stock as fairly as possible among local examiners. Each Flotilla and Division should always maintain a back-up supply. PLEASE do NOT request an additional supply from me as I do NOT have the resources available.

I'm told that as soon as additional stock is received at ANSC, I'll be notified and I'll pass the word. In the meantime let's continue to share our current supply.

-Kidde Fire Extinguisher Recall

Name of product: Kidde XL Fire Extinguishers

Units: About 167,000

Distributor: Walter Kidde Portable Equipment Inc., of Mebane, N.C.

Hazard: The pressurized cylinders in the recalled fire extinguishers could lose pressure and fail to operate. In the event of a fire, this failure could put a consumer and property at risk.

Incidents/Injuries: None reported.

Description: This recall involves the Kidde XL Fire Extinguishers with model numbers FX340SC, FX340H, FX340GW, XL5MR, FX210R, FX340SC-2, FX210W, XL2.5TCZ-4, E-340-3 and with manufacture dates between October 2007 and April 2008. The model number can be found on the label on the front of the extinguisher. The manufacture year is on the bottom of the extinguisher. If you examine an extinguisher that is one of the listed model numbers and is marked with the year 07 or 08, have yhe boater contact Kidde.

Sold at: Department, home, and hardware stores nationwide from October 2007 through April 2008 for about \$35.

Manufactured in: Mexico

Remedy: Consumers should immediately inspect the pressure gauge. If it points to the red zone, contact Kidde to receive a free replacement extinguisher. If the gauge is not in the red zone, but you have questions about an extinguisher within the listed model numbers, please contact Kidde for additional information.

-OPFAC Changes

There have been two changes to the requirements for inspection of a PWC as an OPFAC.

ANSC 7008, Section VII

1- Item 12: A type IV throwable PFD is no longer required

2-Item 20: A spare spark plug is only required for a 2 cycle engine.

- -The recommended changes for the upcoming revision of the VSC Manual have been posted on the D11NR website: http://rbsafety.d11nuscgaux.info/ve.html. Several DSO-VE's including myself are re-working assigned areas. The target date for DSO suggested revisions is April 1st. At that time, the suggestions will be reviewed for accuracy and will be included in the revised manual. No date has been provided for the project completion.
- -The Vessel Examiner class held in January in Reno had 9 students pass the written examination and the PCA Training Fair at Coast Guard Island had 21 students and ALL passed the written examination! Several are already working on completing their qualification. Please assist your local members in completing the qualification as soon as possible. Along with the Reno class graduates, all of their names will be listed in the April 1st edition of the VSC Newsletter. Thanks to all for supporting this effort. Another class is planned at the August PCA Training Fair.
- -CAL BOATING has advised me that the 2009 ABC's of Boating are in print and should be released by early April. Orders can be placed at: www.dbw.ca.gov. In addition, the promotional order form has also been released. Orders for promotional materials are planned to be distributed prior to NSBW.

Finally, on a sad note Phaedra Bota, a 16-year employee of CAL BOATING and a good friend of the Auxiliary has left the Dept. Her presence will be missed. Currently her position has not been filled.

-As evident by the new logos, Nevada, and the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary have joined the "WEAR IT" campaign. A link to the National Safe Boating Council, the sponsor of the campaign can be found on the D11NR vessel examiner website:
