



205 VSC's were performed over both days-a **NEW** D11NR record for the Coast Guard's law enforcement blitz days! Many examiners drove many miles, donated many hours of their time, and incurred significant expense in helping to educate and prepare the boaters prior to launching this recent weekend. Special thanks to Carrie Van De Boom from 10-03 for her effort in providing a Marine Safety table, meeting and greeting the boaters in line, and directing traffic. She also jumped in to perform a VSC or two when necessary. In addition she and all the vessel examiners kept a smile as they enduring temperatures and walked MANY miles up and down the rows of waiting boaters.

The combined total for the Stockton and Sacramento events is **385 VSC's**! This is a new performance record for this event.
